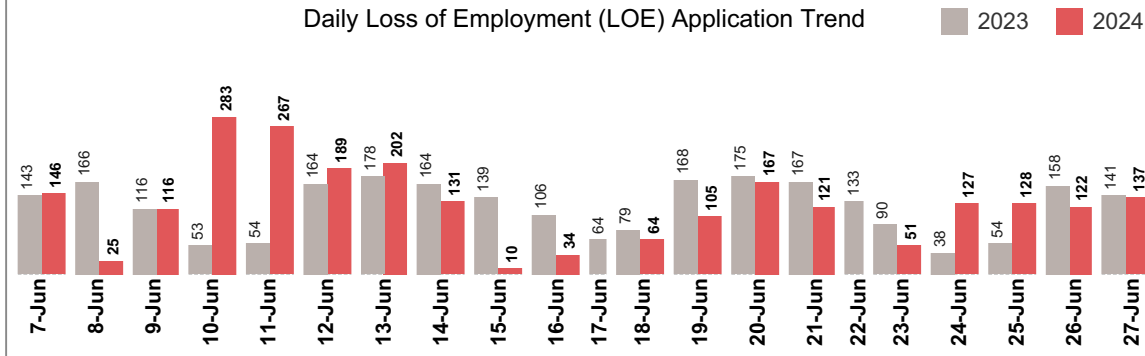

Daily Loss of Employment (LOE) Application Trend

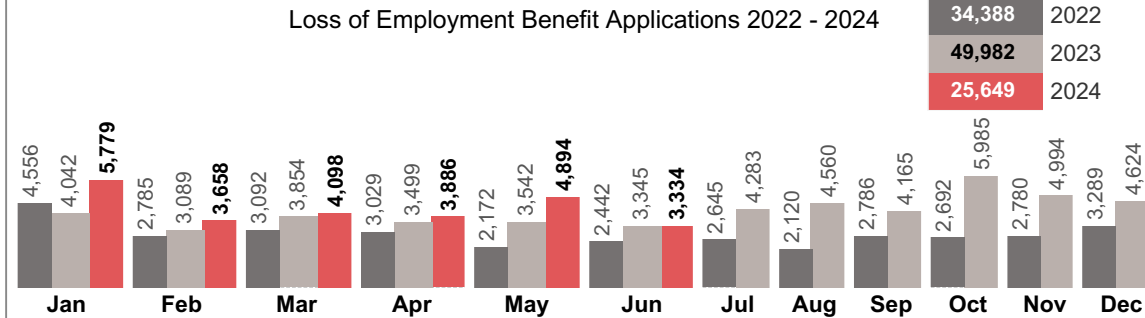


• The number of reported UB applications **decreased** by 13% in **Q1 2024** compared to **Q4 2023**.

• Employees waged below RM3,000 recorded **49%** cases or **12,215** applicants.

• **Manufacturing** industry recorded the highest cases (**35%**), followed by **Wholesale And Retail Trade** (**15%**).

Loss of Employment Benefit Applications 2022 - 2024




• The highest reported LOE claims is in **Selangor** (**28%**) followed by **WP Kuala Lumpur** (**23%**).


• **PMET** (Professionals, Managers, Executive & Technicians) shows the highest occupation category who were **retrenched 50%**.

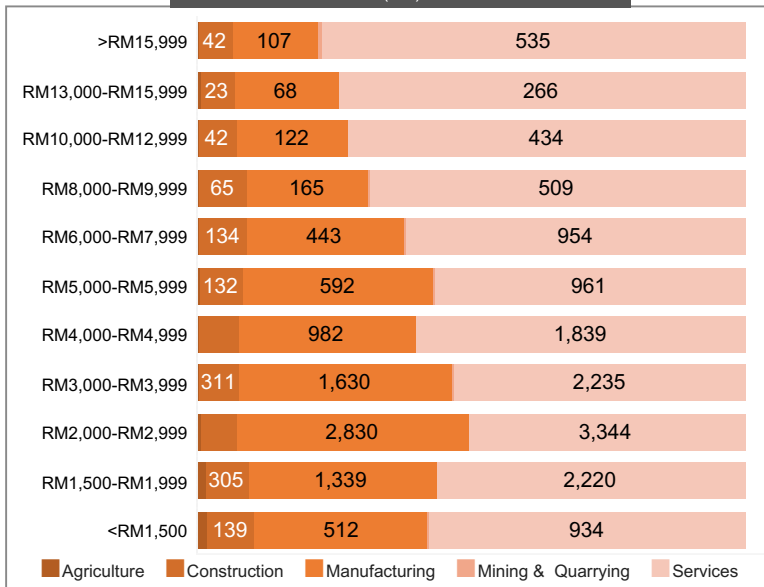

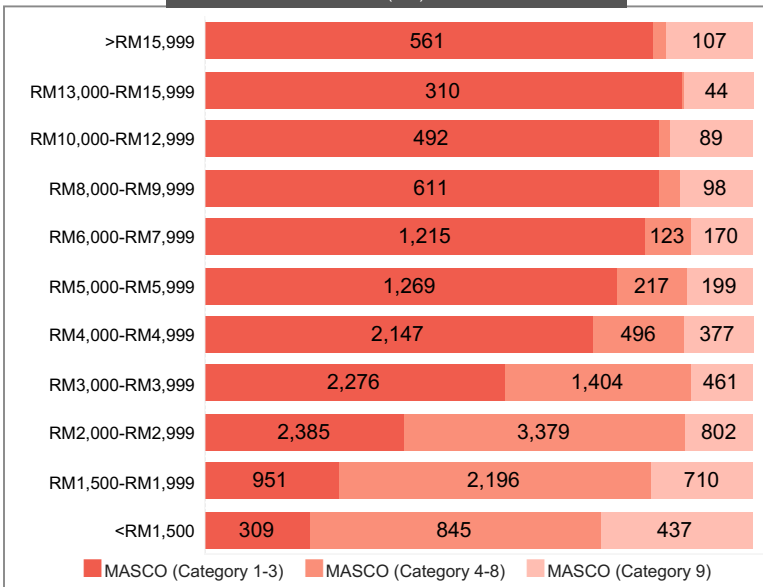

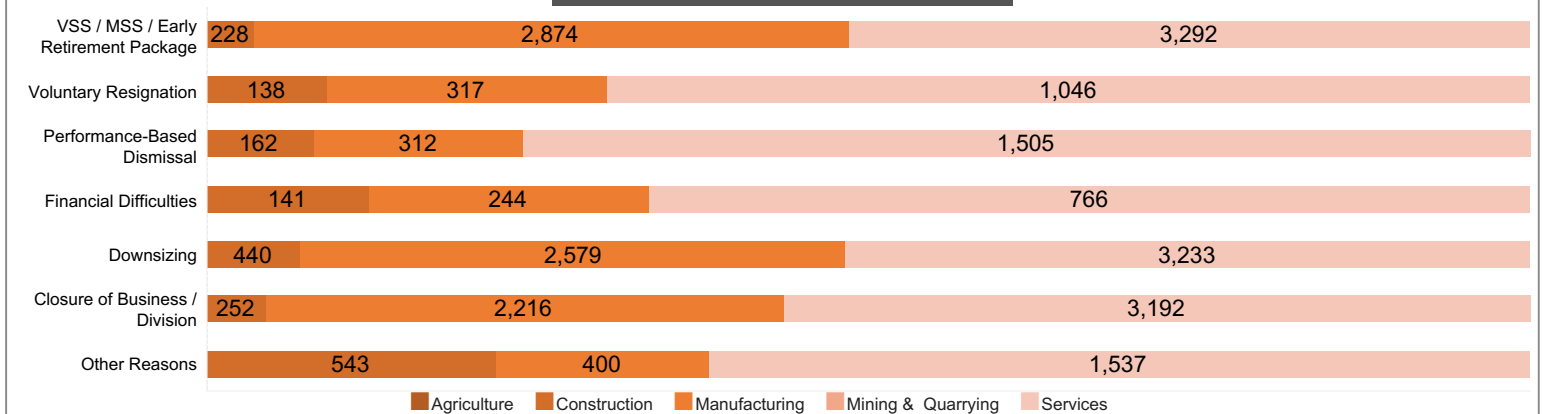
SALARY AVERAGE (RM) vs MAIN SECTORS



SALARY AVERAGE (RM) vs OCCUPATION

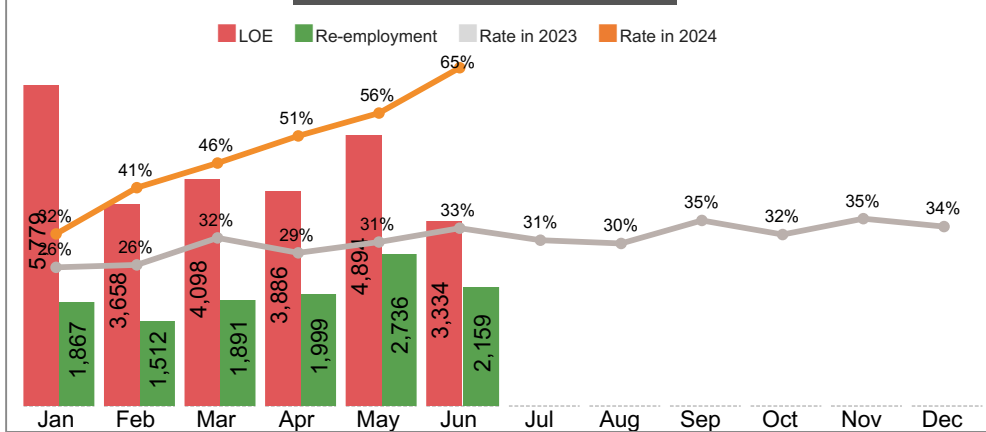


LOE REASONS vs MAIN SECTORS

LOE vs RE-EMPLOYMENT



- The re-employment referred to UB recipients who have submitted claims on the early re-employment allowance (ERA).
- Rate of Insured Person return to work via ERA has **increased by 72% in Q1 2024 compared to Q1 2023.**
- The percentage of re-employment is **47%** over the number of job loss as at **June 27, 2024.**

*The number of re-employment stated is based on the numbers of registered IP who re-enters the workforce via ERA
