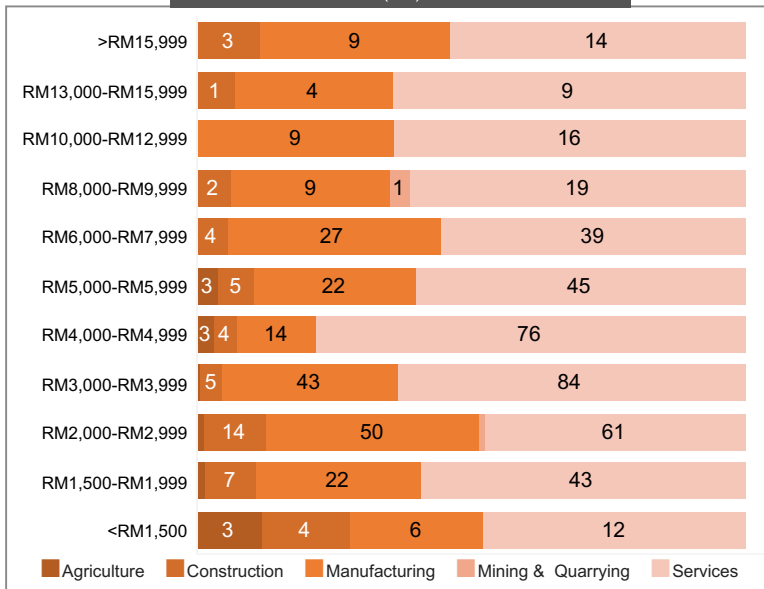


- The number of reported UB applications **increased by 7%** in **Q4 2024 compared to Q3 2024**.
- Employees waged below RM3,000 recorded **32%** cases or **226** applicants.
- **Manufacturing** industry recorded the highest cases (**31%**), followed by **Wholesale And Retail Trade (13%)**.
- The highest reported LOE claims is in **Selangor (31%)** followed by **WP Kuala Lumpur (19%)**.
- **PMET** (Professionals, Managers, Executive & Technicians) shows the highest occupation category who were **retrenched 66%**.

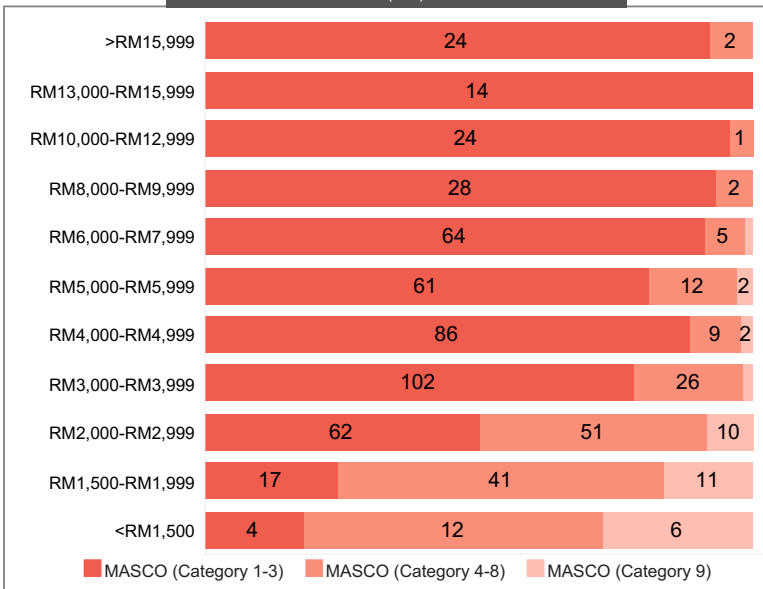

(cumulative as of 02 January 2025)



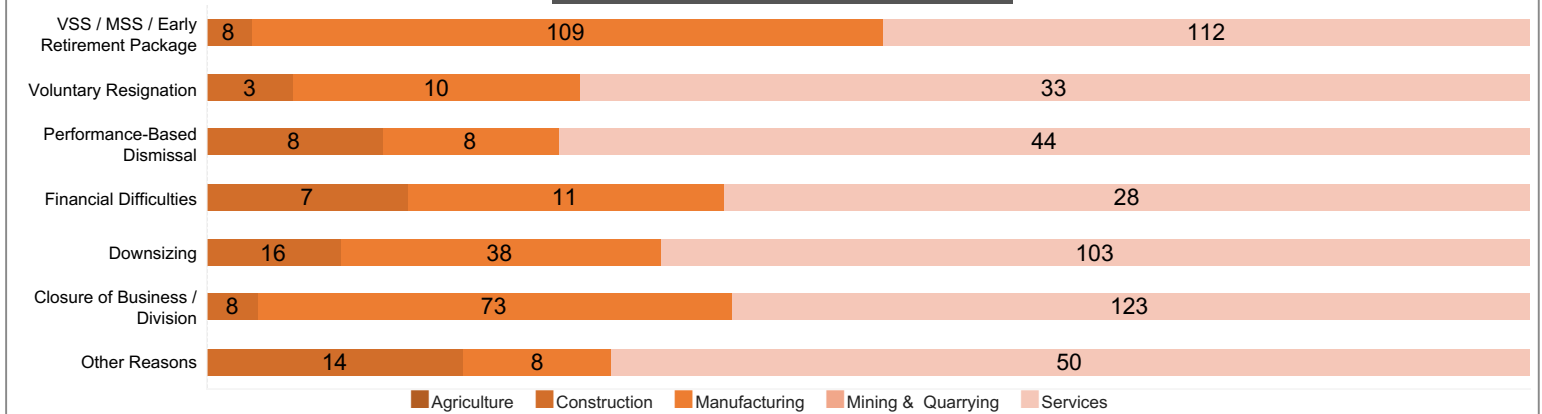
SALARY AVERAGE (RM) vs MAIN SECTORS

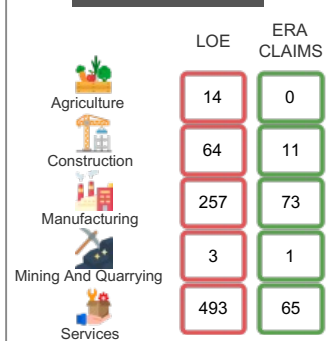
